

WHAT'S HAPPENING TO 300,000 PEOPLE ON NOVEMBER 6 |

Sprint CEO Marcelo Claure publicly professes a deep commitment to closing the digital divide. "Everybody should have the opportunity to reach their full potential," Claure says.

But on November 6, Sprint will shut off internet access to more than 300,000 vulnerable Americans.

Sprint should stop this injustice and stand up for the hundreds of thousands of children, teachers, families and seniors from all corners of the country who will be shut out of the American dream without access to the Internet.

Mobile Citizen and Mobile Beacon offer a critical service, providing unlimited Internet access to underserved Americans for just \$10 a month.

Sprint should support this effort, not pull the plug on it. It should keep these schools, libraries and nonprofits online until it can provide them with a viable alternative to get the Internet access they need. In addition, Sprint should stop throttling their Internet service. America's students cannot succeed if they are in the slow lane.

Join the movement. Tell Sprint to stop its plan to shut down the network that serves Mobile Citizen and Mobile Beacon's community of schools, nonprofits, libraries and families and get them transitioned onto a new network.
