## Bridging the Gap Partnership Distributed 200 Computers and Mobile Internet to Ohio Jobseekers

- Digital Equity: Making sure individuals and families have equal access to technology vital tools for full participation in today's society.
- Access to technology is essential to educational success as well as workforce and community development.
- Bridging the Gap is a nonprofit-led initiative of PCs for People and Mobile Beacon that helps community anchor institutions like housing authorities, schools, libraries, and nonprofits provide affordable computers and internet access to eligible low-income individuals and families.

Ohio Means Jobs| Cleveland-Cuyahoga County (OMJ|CC) is a critical workforce development partner in the county helping individuals get on a meaningful and sustainable career path. OMJ|CC is now part of Bridging the Gap, a nonprofit-led initiative of PCs for People and Mobile Beacon that helps community anchor institutions like housing authorities, schools, libraries, and nonprofits provide affordable computers and internet access to eligible low-income individuals and families. Together, OMJ|CC, PCs for People and Mobile Beacon distributed 200 free desktop computers and mobile internet hotspots to local job seekers. This collaboration was created because of the organizations' shared vision to promote digital equity by ensuring individuals have equal access to technology to fully participate in today's digital society.

Access to technology is essential to educational success as well as workforce and community development. According to a recently released report by Jonathan Sallet for the Benton Institute, today, over 80 percent of jobs that require a high-school degree and pay a living wage require digital skills, but there are not enough Americans with the digital skills to fill these positions. OMJ|CC is using Bridging the Gap to change that by providing local job seekers with the necessary tools and support they need to secure a career in a recognized "Opportunity Occupation", which has been identified as an occupation that provides good wages with long-term career potential.
